PARKOUR RESULTS AND SCORING FACT SHEET

Display to Public and Athletes:

Minimum: Large Timing Device for Speed Run and Freestyle

Timing:

Time is measured with a timekeeping system measuring in 1/1000th of a second. The time shown will be rounded to 1/100th of a second, e.g. time measured: 20,349, time shown: 20,35. In case of e.g. 20.245 the rounding shall be made in favour of the athlete, the time shown is 20,24.

Should there be no timekeeping system available or should there be a malfunction or breakdown of the system, the time will be measured by the ST-judge, who in any case, will always measure the time manually as a back-up. In case that the finish line is not near the start-line, the time will be measured by a time judge at the finish line. Manual time measurement with a chronometer must be guaranteed at least in 1/10th of a second.

Timing Speed-Run: (NEW- requires FIG approval by March 1, will confirm)

Start and finish

The athlete(s) must be ready to be called by the speaker to present themselves at the start-line according to the start list.

When the speaker requests the athlete(s) to present themselves at the start-line, the athlete(s) must do so without delay.

Failure to be present at the start-line later than 30 seconds (controlled by the ST judge) after having been called will result in disqualification from that run.

The start-line and time judge (ST) will ask if the athlete(s) is/are ready. When the athlete(s) verbally indicates their readiness, they must place one foot on the start line without crossing it. A gun fires and starts the time for the athlete(s). If the athlete(s) crosses the start line before the gun, they will be disqualified (DSQ). They may have a second-run in the qualifications if they DSQ on the first run, but not in the Final. A second-run would be taken after all other athletes have completed their first run, in the same order of the original start list. In the Qualifications the gun will fire a second time if an early start is detected, signaling DSQ.

Timing Note:

The start time begins with the firing of the gun, while start sensors detect a false start. The finish sensors detect the time of the speed-run for each athlete individually. If two athletes perform the Speed-Run simultaneously, the best time must be visually shown.

For the athletes who have chosen to have a second run, the result of the second run only counts.

Timing Freestyle:

Start and end

The athletes must be ready to be called by the speaker to present himself on the field of play according to the start list.

When the speaker requests the athlete to go on the field of play, the athlete must do so without delay.

Failure to be present himself on the field of play at a start-point of his discretion later than 30 seconds after having been called will result in disqualification by the judge who is also acting as CJP.

The athlete must begin his performance upon a signal of the judge who is also acting as CJP, the speaker or a countdown. Timing of the performance (max. 90 seconds) will begin with the signal of the judge, the speaker or at the end of the countdown. The athlete may end his performance at any place of the field of play at his discretion.

Should the athlete perform for more than 90 seconds, the judges will not consider any tricks or movements beyond this time and the judge who is also acting as CJP will deduct 3 points from the total score of the jury.

Timing

If available, timing of the performance will be shown on a screen. An audible signal to the athlete will be given after 80 and 85 seconds and a final signal after 90 seconds.

Breach of Rules:

for apparel, publicity, advertising and manufactures logos (competition clothing)

Penalties:

Breach of these rules in a penalty of 2 seconds added to the final time for speed-run by the CJP and in freestyle a deduction of 4 points from the total score of the jury by the judge who is also acting as Chair of Judges Panel (CJP).

Tie-breaking rules for the speed-run ranking:

Time is shown in 1/100th of a second.

If there is a tie, the tie will be broken by using the next digit (1/1000th of a second). If there is still a tie, the tie will not be broken.

Exception:

To determine the starting order and the pairs in the Final, the ties must be broken by a draw.

Tie-breaking rules for the freestyle ranking

In case of a tie in points at any place in Qualification and Finals, the ranking will be determined by the following criteria:

1. The higher score for Execution, Safety and Mastery
2. The higher score for Use of the course and Creativity
3. The higher score for Difficulty
4. The average of all judges' scores given for Execution, Safety and Mastery, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score
5. The average of all judges' scores given for Use of the course and Creativity, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score
6. The average of all judges' scores given for Difficulty, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score

If there is still a tie, the tie will not be broken.

Exception:

To determine the starting order and the pairs in the Final, the ties must be broken by a draw.

IRM (from Technical Regulations)

Some specific designations are used to report invalid results.

DNS "Did not start" indicates that the gymnast did not perform a routine or did not attempt a vault. If they just present to the judges and perform nothing, no score will be awarded and a designation of DNS will be awarded.

DNF "Did not finish" indicates that a gymnast did start a performance but did not finish sufficient movement to be awarded a score by the judges. It also indicates that a gymnast did not complete a phase of the competition after having started.

DSQ "Disqualified" is the designation given by the authorities for serious technical infringements of the rules. "Disqualified" is the designation given as a result of positive doping results.

DNS and DNF have the following consequences in certain situations:

- no qualification into further rounds of that apparatus, or further phase of the competition if applicable.

"DSQ" as mentioned in the Code of Points and TR Section 1, Art. 5.5 and 9.3.2, Section 3, Art. 5.1.5, Section 5 Art. 5 has the following consequences:

- the results are eliminated and removed from that phase of the competition
- the name of the athlete is removed from that phase of the competition
- the athletes' ranking for that phase of the competition is recalculated

Scoring and Result Service:

FIG will provide a scoring and result system, including a high-quality video system which allows the recording, storage and provision of compilation of the recorded images. DETAILS: This means two video camera operators capturing the entire speed-run or freestyle exercise of every athlete. These videos could be used in case of an inquiry by the judges, future judges' training, and also for promotional purposes after each phase of competition.

The Technical Delegate is responsible that the results of the competition, signed by him, are sent by e-mail to the FIG Office and the LOC/FISE immediately after the end of the respective competitions.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

- Do you want us to do Timing (Speedrun) + Scoring (freestyle) - or Timing only?

Answer: You must do timing for Speed Run and Freestyle, plus scoring of Freestyle.

- Are there any special rules for the ranking of DNS, DNF and DSQ?

Answer: Yes, the order is DSQ, DNF, DNS.

- Any specific formats of the Start-List Prints?

Answer: Choice of the scorer, but must include full name (last name in capital letters), federation, and FIG age.

- Are there more Result lists formats than Public and FIG?

Answer: No
