	Qualifications The starting order and starting lane for the first run of Qualification will be determined by a draw. An intermediate ranking list is established at the end of the first run.
	The athletes may choose to have a second run. Should they choose a second run, they have to announce it immediately after the end of their course (max. 10 seconds) by raising their hand. If an athlete requests a second run, they will run after all athletes have completed their first run, and all second run athletes will follow in the same order of the original start list while skipping the athletes only performing one run, and starting lane will be drawn.

Athletes will run two at a time, unless it is not possible due to uneven athlete numbers. Male athletes will run the course in two directions, while female athletes will run the course in one direction.

For the athletes who have chosen to have a second run, the result of the second run only counts. The final ranking list of the Qualification will be established at the end of the second run. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in the Technical Regulations, Section 7, art. 3.1 - Exception - apply.

Semi-Finals

The top 10-12 athletes from the final ranking list of the Qualification participate in the Semi-Final.

In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in Technical Regulations, Section 7, art. 3.1 apply.

Athletes will run two at a time, unless it is not possible due to uneven athlete numbers. Male athletes will run the course in two directions, while female athletes will run the course in one direction.

The number of participants and races is dependent on the number of athletes that successfully completed the Qualification:

11 or less athletes = no Semi-Final

12 to 13 athletes = Semi-Final of top 10 (5 pairs/races)

14 or more athletes = Semi-Final of top 12 (6 pairs/races)

No second run is permitted in the Semi-Finals.

The starting order is established based on the ranking after Qualification. The athlete with the better qualifying time in Qualification will run in lane 1 (farthest of the judges' tower).

The last pair to run is the fastest qualifying time vs. the slowest qualifying time. i.e. with 10 participants (1st pair) Number 5 vs. Number 6, (2nd pair) Number 4 vs. Number 7, (3rd pair) Number 3 vs. Number 8, (4th pair) Number 2 vs. Number 9, (5th pair) Number 1 vs. Number 10.

Finals

The top 8 athletes from the final ranking list of the Semi-Finals participate in the Finals. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in Technical Regulations, Section 7, art. 3.1 apply.

Athletes will run two at a time. Male athletes will run the course in two directions, while female athletes will run the course in one direction.

No second run is permitted in the Finals.

The starting order is established based on the ranking after Semi-Finals: i.e. (1st pair) Number 7 vs. Number 8, (2nd pair) Number 5 vs. Number 6, (3rd pair) Number 3 vs. Number 4, (4th pair) Number 1 vs. Number 2. The top 3 times overall determine the medal winners.

Specific Rules Start and finish

The athlete must be ready to be called by the speaker to present himself at the start-line according to the start list.

When the speaker requests the athlete to present himself at the start-line, the athlete must do so without delay.

Failure to be present at the start-line later than 30 seconds (controlled by the ST judge) after having been called will result in disqualification from that run.

The start-line and time judge (ST) will ask if the athlete is ready. Starter says "Take your Mark", "Set", then fires the gun or signal. At "Take your Mark" athlete(s) places their foot to the start line. At "Set" the athlete prepares for the gun/signal. Each lane keeps its own start and finish time by use of sensors.

Line Violations

If an athlete steps over the boundary lines for their lane, they will be disgualified for that individual race.

Timing

Time is measured with a timekeeping system measuring in $1/1000^{th}$ of a second. The time shown will be rounded to $1/100^{th}$ of a second, e.g. time measured: 20,349, time shown: 20,35. In case of e.g. 20.245 the rounding shall be made in favour of the athlete, the time shown is 20,24. Should there be no timekeeping system available or should there be a malfunction or breakdown of the system, the time will be measured by the ST-judge, who in any case, will always measure the time manually as a back-up. In case that the finish line is not near the start-line, the time will be measured by a time judge at the finish line. Manual time measurement with a chronometer must be guaranteed at least in $1/10^{th}$ of a second.

Freestyle

Qualifications

The starting order for the first run of Qualification will be determined by a draw. The runs of a maximum of 90 seconds, are judged based on the criteria defined in the Code of Points.

An intermediate ranking list is established at the end of the first run.

The athletes may choose to have a second run. Should they choose a second run, they have to announce it immediately after the end of their course (before the score is shown) by raising their hand. If an athlete requests a second run, they will run after all athletes have completed their first run, and all second run athletes will follow in the same order of the original start list while skipping the athletes only performing one run.

For the athletes who have chosen to have a second run, the result of the second run only counts. The final ranking list of the Qualification will be established at the end of the second run.

In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in the Technical Regulations, Section 7, art. 3.2 apply.

Finals

The top eight athletes from the final ranking list of the Qualification participate in the Final. In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules set out in the Technical Regulations, Section 7, art. 3.2 apply.

The Final is held in one single run.

The starting order is established based on the ranking after Qualification with the best athlete starting last.

Specific Rules

Start and end

The athletes must be ready to be called by the speaker to present himself on the field of play according to the start list.

When the speaker requests the athlete to go on the field of play, the athlete must do so without delay.

Failure to be present himself on the field of play at a start-point of his discretion later than 30 seconds after having been called will result in disqualification by the judge who is also acting as CJP.

The athlete must begin his performance upon a signal of the judge who is also acting as CJP, the speaker or a countdown. Timing of the performance (max. 90 seconds) will begin with the signal of the judge, the speaker or at the end of the countdown. The athlete may end his performance at any place of the field of play at his discretion. Should the athlete perform for more than 90 seconds, the judges will not consider any

tricks or movements beyond this time and the judge who is also acting as CJP will deduct 3 points from the total score of the jury.

Timing

If available, timing of the performance will be shown on a screen. An audible signal to the athlete will be given after 80 seconds and a final signal after 90 seconds.

TIE BREAKING RULES	 Tie-breaking rules for the Speed ranking (TR, Section 2, art. 3.1) Time is measured in 1/1000th of a second and shown in 1/100th of a second. If there is a tie, the tie will be broken by using the next digit (1/1000th of a second). If there is still a tie, the tie will not be broken. Semi-Finals and Finals to determine the starting order and the pairs: any unbroken ties must be determined by a draw. Tie-breaking rules for the Freestyle ranking (TR, Section 7, art. 3.2) In case of a tie in points at any place in Qualification and Finals, the ranking will be determined by the following criteria: The higher score for Execution, Safety and Mastery The higher score for Difficulty The average of all judges' scores given for Execution, Safety and Mastery, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score The average of all judges' scores given for Use of the course and Creativity, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score The average of all judges' scores given for Difficulty, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score The average of all judges' scores given for Difficulty, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score The average of all judges' scores given for Difficulty, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score The average of all judges' scores given for Difficulty, without eliminating the highest and the lowest score 			
	The prize money of the tied ranks will be added and divided by the number of ties.			
FEDERATIONS INVITED PARTICIPATION	All invitations will be sent based on the WUG Qualification document. For the athletes directly invited, the WUG LOC will cover travel expenses, accommodation and full board. These expenses will be covered for 1 Head of Delegation/Coach. Federations must make the final athlete registration.			
SIZE OF DELEGATION AND FIG LICENSE	Only senior athletes in good standing with the correct age and holding a valid FIG License at the time of registration until the end of the competitions may participate. No athletes will be accepted without a valid FIG License before the start of competition. The maximum size of the invited delegation is as follows:

	For the 2019 WUG, the Judges will be invited by the FIG. The FIG Technical Delegate will be the President of the FIG Parkour Commission. He will serve as President of the Superior Jury.			
INVITATION DEADLINE	Federations must observe all registration deadlines detailed in the invitations to athletes. The FIG registration deadline to confirm participation is 25 July 2019 .

MEALS	Breakfast for athletes, team officials and IF representatives will be provided at the hotel and lunch at the venue. Dinner will be provided at the hotel on Wednesday and Thursday and at the venue on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.
INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTATION	Flights purchased for all passengers will be economy class with one piece of checked in luggage, one piece of hand luggage and personal sport equipment items for athletes only. Please note that after confirming the flights with the LOC travel team, the costs of any modifications will be borne by the traveler. All participants wishing to arrive by train or bus will be given contact information for ticket purchase. Athlete or Federation must make the travel booking through FIG (Form).
LOCAL TRANSPORTATION	Airport transfers to and from official hotels will be organised by the LOC based on flight details for all participants booked through the LOC. Ground transportation between the official hotels and the venue will be provided by the LOC. The schedules will be available at the hotel's WUG hospitality desk and at the venue.
