- In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules as set up in the Technical Regulations, Section 2 be applied.

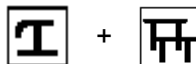

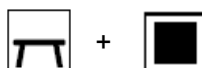

**Finals:**

- The best eight gymnasts per apparatus from the qualifications qualify for the Finals
- Participation is limited to 2 gymnasts per NF and each apparatus.
- In addition to the 8 finalists, if the Organizing Member Federation is not represented in the Finals (men or women), it has the right of maximum 2 wild cards as follows (1 man and 1 woman gymnast only at one apparatus each). These “Wild Card Gymnasts” must have participated at the respective apparatus in the qualification. “Wild Card Gymnasts” will receive medals prize money.
- In case of a tie at any place, the tie-breaking rules as set up in the Technical Regulations, Section 2, shall be applied.

## **15. Accreditations**

The accreditation is personal, non transferable and compulsory to control access to training, competition hall, functions and official transport. It identifies individuals participating in the World Challenge Cup and ensures controlled access to each area. All participants and officials are required at all times, to wear Accreditation Cards and respect those personnel responsible for monitoring entry.

Accreditation will take place upon arrival at Palace of Culture and Sports

Heads of Delegations are requested to bring:

- Passports of all members of the delegation
- Insurances of all members of the delegation
- National anthem and national flag confirmation
- Competitor's music WAG (CD or USB for backup reason)
- Proof for full payment of the costs due to the LOC
- Transport – Departure
- License of the gymnast
- Vault Numbers for all MAG and WAG Competitions and number of Vault performed in MAG and WAG

Qualifications for each gymnast

- Starting orders for the Qualifications, FX Starting Order for WAG Podium Training
- New Elements for MAG and WAG
- Request to change the apparatus measurement for MAG and WAG

The FIG Accreditation Rules will be strictly applied, notably as far as the number of accreditations per federations is concerned. Any additional person is considered as a spectator. Accreditations will not be delivered unless all financial and insurance obligations have been met.

Copies of the delegation member's valid passport will be made by the OC. Please refer to the FIG license rules for

further information.

In case of lost or stolen accreditation, the Organising Committee must be informed immediately to block the accreditation. Lost or stolen accreditations may be replaced at the charge of the card holder (€ 50).

The FIG Accreditation rules have to be strictly respected. This accreditation may not be transferred during an event.

**IMPORTANT:** Changes to registrations can only be made until ACCREDITATION. During the Orientation Meeting only WITHDRAWAL can be made.

## **16. Insurance**

The Host Federation, the Organizing Committee and the WG will not be held responsible for any liabilities in case of accidents, illness, repatriation and the like. The WG Technical Regulations foresee that all participating Federations are responsible for making their own arrangements to have the necessary valid insurance coverage against illness, accidents and for repatriation for all the members of their Delegation. The LOC will subsequently offer insurance at the Federations own charge as follows: 10 EUR per person/day.

## **17. Competition (BIB) Numbers**

The competition numbers will be provided to the head of delegations by the O.C. at the Orientation meeting. The numbers are to be firmly attached to the competition attire during the whole competition.

## **18. Music - WAG**

The following information must be written on the backup CD/USB:

- The name of the gymnast
- The 3 capitalized letters used by FIG for the country code
- The name of the composer and
- The name of the title of the music
- The CD/USB must be timed

## **19. Orientation Meeting**

The Orientation Meeting will be held on Wednesday, 06th from 20:00 to 21:30 at Apollo Hotel. The presence of the participating NF to the orientation meeting is mandatory. Delegations have to attend this meeting with a maximum of 2 accredited members per delegation. Please note that judges may not represent their Federation at the Orientation Meeting.

All participating federations must provide at least one judge with a valid FIG Brevet. Failure to do so will result in a fine of Swiss Francs 2 000,00.

The Judges Meetings will take place in the Palace of Culture and Sports (Judges room)

## **21. New elements for Artistic Gymnastics**

Please submit the new elements as follows:

- For the MAG – before the start of the podium training to the FIG Technical Delegate – Jing LI
- For the WAG – before the start of the podium training to the FIG Technical Delegate – Lyudmila LI

## **22. Inquiries procedure**

The inquiries procedure refers to FIG/TR 2026

Only the Difficulty Score (D-score) may be subject to an Inquiry.

Inquiries cannot be withdrawn once submitted.

Only the designated NF Authorised Representative (a coach or delegation member, but under no circumstances a judge) for the specific gymnast(s), group, or unit may submit inquiries. They must be present in the Inquiry Area on the field of play.

An NF is not permitted to submit inquiries on behalf of gymnasts from other NFs.

The Inquiry Officer must be a judge from the organising NF, or, if not possible, from a participating NF. They must hold at least the highest national qualification, but preferably a FIG international brevet judge. They must have a working knowledge of English.

The Inquiry Officer will receive instructions from the President of the Superior Jury (or the Technical Delegate) and will oversee the inquiry process, including confirming the identity of the NF Authorised Representative.

The Inquiry Officer may offer guidance to the NF Authorised Representative in submitting inquiries. However, the NF Authorised Representative remains fully and solely responsible for the proper and timely submission of inquiries in accordance with the provisions of this Article.

The NF Authorised Representative submits a completed official inquiry form to the Inquiry Officer, who records the time of receipt.

Inquiries must be submitted within two minutes after the score is displayed. The Inquiry Officer shall use best efforts to manually establish and record the timely submission, if possible, using an official inquiry form.

Official Inquiry Form: Inquiries must be submitted using the official inquiry form to the Inquiry Officer:

\* before the score for the next gymnast, group or unit is displayed or,

\* for the last gymnast, group or unit in a rotation, within two minutes after the score is displayed. The

Inquiry Officer will verify if the inquiry was submitted within the deadline and record this on the official inquiry form.

Late or incorrectly submitted inquiries will be rejected by the President of the Technical Delegate. The rejection must be recorded on the Official Inquiry Form.

The decision not to accept an inquiry—whether due to it being filed late or not following the correct procedure—is final and cannot be challenged.

If multiple inquiries are submitted simultaneously, the first recorded inquiry's submission time will apply to all inquiries submitted on time.

The Inquiry Officer will record the submission time on the official inquiry form.

Timely and properly submitted inquiries will be reviewed by the President of the Superior Jury (or, if applicable, the Technical Delegate) using official competition footage only.

The decision will be made as quickly as possible, except for Apparatus Finals, where the inquiry must be resolved before the next gymnast score is displayed.

The score may be increased, reduced, or remain unchanged after the inquiry review.

Decisions on inquiries are final field-of-play decisions and cannot be challenged internally or externally, including appeals to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), which has no jurisdiction over any challenge. This rule overrides any prior or future provisions granting CAS broader jurisdiction.

The cost per inquiry is CHF 300 for the first, CHF 500 for the second, and CHF 1,000 for each subsequent inquiry throughout the entire duration of the competition (and not starting from “1” again at each competition phase).

If the Difficulty score is increased, the fee is waived; if it remains unchanged or is reduced, the fee is charged to the NF and transferred to the FIG Foundation for Solidarity.

Inquiry costs will be invoiced to the NFs by the FIG after the competition. No payment will be accepted on site.

Rankings are considered final once all inquiries have been processed and the results are confirmed and signed by the Technical Delegate.

Requests to revise Time or Line Deductions or Bonuses

Requests to revise Time or Line deductions or Bonuses, as allowed by the Code of Points for certain disciplines, are treated separately from inquiries and do not incur any cost. However, such requests must comply with the same principles, procedures, and deadlines specified in this article for inquiries.

Requests to revise other neutral deductions or penalties are not permitted.

### **23. Transportation**

Accredited team delegations that will stay at one of the official hotels, book their accommodation through the Organizing Committee, will be provided with local transport from Varna Airport to the official hotels and back. This airport - hotel service will be guaranteed by the Organizing Committee only for delegation who booked their accommodations through the OC. Delegations that are not booked their accommodation through the Organizing Committee will be charge 50EUR per person.

A shuttle service from the official hotels to the training, and competition venues as well as meals and any other planned activities and back as needed will be available for the local transport of all accredited persons who booked accommodations through the OC.

Shuttle buses will leave the Competition Venue and the Hotels according to the schedule they will follow strictly. **Please be on time!!!**

### **24. Meals**

Breakfast and dinner are included in the price of each of the hotels.

Breakfast will be available from 07:30 to 10:00 each day.

The OC will offer a lunch at the competition venue each day from 11:30 to 14:30. Price per lunch/ per person/ per day: 35 euro. This lunch is not compulsory and delegations are free to make alternative arrangements at their cost. Credentials and meal tickets must be displayed to access the meals.

Dinner meals will be served between 18:00 and 21:00.

### **25. Medical Services**

The Organizing Committee will provide medical services. A special room is marked with “Medical Room”.

### **26. Doping controls**

Anti-doping controls will be organised by the International Testing Agency (ITA) on behalf of the FIG and according to the WADA Code, Standards and FIG AntiDoping Rules. The doping controls may take place at any time during the training, podium training or competition times.

### **27. Opening Ceremony**

The Opening Ceremony will take place on Saturday, May 09<sup>th</sup> from 13:15. All delegation members are invited to present at the Opening Ceremony.

### **28. Medal Award Ceremony**

According to the WG TR (Section 1, Art. 9.3.3), all the gymnasts have to wear their national tracksuits.

Only the medal winners are invited to participate.

The award ceremonies will take place as follow:

For MAG:

- For FX Apparatus Final – on Saturday, 09<sup>th</sup> of May, at 14:38
- For PH Apparatus Final – on Saturday, 09<sup>th</sup> of May, at 16:04

- For VT Apparatus Final – on Sunday, 10<sup>th</sup> of May, at 14:38
- For PB Apparatus Final – on Sunday, 10<sup>th</sup> of May, at 16:04
